

Works Completed during the last week.

Week 108: Monday 17 December to Friday 21 December 2007

- With the Christmas break approaching the main emphasis of the works on site has been to complete the on-going works and to make the site secure for the holiday period.
- To the north of the site fitting out of the café interior has continued; works have included
 - tiling of walls and floor
 - electrical fitting within the main café area
 - painting of woodwork
- Outside the café building construction of the new interactive water feature has continued. The pump sump has been built and all pipework and ducting installed. Work has begun on the installation of the precast concrete rings that will form the main support for the feature.

- At the southern end of the works a number of works have been carried out to North Promenade and the immediate area. Lancashire County Council, as the Highways Authority, has made good the surfacing in front of the new kerbing which has enabled the temporary road closure to be lifted over the Christmas period.
- In the plaza area the southern set of steps that link the two levels has been constructed. The steps have been made using the same white concrete that has been used for the majority of the promenade works.

- Other works that have been carried out during the week include
 - fixing of timber seating along promenade wall
 - fixing of precast concrete seating on promenade
 - connection of electrical cabling for plaza lighting
 - fixing of timber boarding to new groynes
 - placing of rocks to form groyne extensions
 - driving of sheet steel piles to form extension to the access slide at Beach Road.

The awards will be presented by ICE President David Orr at the 81st Annual Awards Dinner in Liverpool on 8 February 2008
