

Works Completed during the last week.

Week 220: Monday 8th February to Friday 12th February 2010.

- With neap tides and good weather work progressed on both the beach and promenade this week.
- On the promenade the remaining two pavement slabs were poured along with the two flights of steps between the lower and upper promenade. These steps cast in white concrete alternated with three ramps provide five access points along the split level promenade.
- The new sea wall is provided with three openings, two of which have a combined pedestrian access ramp and steps. Stone fill was placed and compacted to line and level ready for concrete.
- The remaining two pad foundations to the last of the proposed three shelters was cast along with the installation of electrical ducting.

Formwork to stepped access between lower and upper promenade erected ready for concrete to be cast.

- The electrical installation commenced this week starting with cabling within the maze of ductwork previously installed between electrical feeder pillar locations and all the termination points such as lighting columns.
- The second of the two groynes was completed with the remaining boards being bolted to the timber piles.
- Work commenced on the terminal groyne this week. This groyne, 160metres long and constructed of rock is situated at the northern end of works close to Thornton Gate and is being constructed in order to retain beach material which has become problematic forming deep channels along the beach fronting the defences. Work commenced on the rock bed which will form the foundation to the large pieces of rock armour.
